SUPPLEMENTAL NARRATIVE:

Initial Case Narrative by W. D. Murphy #833 on 07/08/09 at 1327 hrs. Total Dictation Time = 3:05 mins.

On Sunday, 07/05/09, the Pima County Sheriff's Department (PCSD) conducted a sobriety checkpoint on Mount Lemmon Highway at Milepost 7.4. The checkpoint was conducted from 1445 hours to 1745 hours.

The briefing for the checkpoint was held at the Rincon District Substation. As part of the briefing, each participant completed a sobriety checkpoint briefing checklist. Lieutenant K. J. Woolridge #858 acted as the checkpoint commander. I was the Line supervisor for this event.

A total of nine deputy sheriff's participated in the checkpoint, along with three Sheriff's Auxiliary Volunteers (SAV). The checkpoint was operated for both eastbound and westbound traffic on Mount Lemmon Highway. The checkpoint was open from 1445 hours to 1745 hours.

Deputies made contact with 1092 vehicles. A total of seven Driving Under the Influence investigations were conducted. These resulted in the arrest of one individual for Driving Under the Influence of Alcohol, one arrest was made for an Open Container of Alcohol, and a third arrest was made for Driving on a Suspended License. Three vehicles were impounded.

The estimated waiting time ranged from zero to twenty-five seconds, with the average contact at approximately fifteen seconds.
