**SUPPLEMENTAL NARRATIVE:**

Initial Case Narrative by D. S. Hanna #1258 on 08/22/10 at 1609 hrs.

On Saturday, 08/21/10, at 2000 hours, I conducted a briefing for a sobriety checkpoint that was scheduled to be operated in conjunction with the Oro Valley Police Department at 8500 North Oracle Road. The briefing was held in the City Chambers Meeting Room where both the Pima County Sheriff's Department and Oro Valley officers met for the briefing, as well as the Sheriff's Auxiliary Volunteers (SAV's) and Arizona Rangers. At the conclusion of the briefing that was delivered via Power Point, all of the sobriety checkpoint briefing checklists were completed and operations and assignments were given out in full detail.

Shortly thereafter, members went to the site of the sobriety checkpoint which I had marked and painted on the roadway. I conducted field sobriety tests at that site and there did not appear to be any issues as far as the levelness or landscape of the site where the field sobriety tests were to be performed.

It was established that Officer Wiggins of the Oro Valley Police Department would be conducting blood draws, as he was needing blood draw numbers as he went to a new assignment. Not knowing his proficiency or style, I had him conduct a blood draw on me prior to the operations at the sobriety checkpoint. I explained to Sergeant Sickelbower, the DUI Supervisor, that this was one of the ways I supervised the phlebotomists for the Sheriff's Department, as I am the phlebotomy coordinator. Officer Wiggins drew my blood without creating any bruises whatsoever, even afterwards.

The checkpoint became operational at 2000 hours. It was a one-side operation. Southbound was operational at 2101 hours. Northbound was operational at 2115 hours. Southbound was operational at 2130 hours. During this time, I was advised that there was a three-car motor vehicle collision south of the checkpoint for northbound. Learning of this, I had Sergeant Murphy drive northbound on Oracle to ensure that all signs were up in the proper areas properly posted, which they were. I also double-checked with Deputy E. C. Curtin #1154 to ensure that the signs were properly posted, as he was on the Sign Crew. At 2145 hours, northbound was operational. Both sides, northbound and southbound, were operational at 2200 hours. Due to traffic congestion, we reverted back to the one-sided operations at 2215 hours for southbound. At 2228 hours, both were operational once again.

There were 1338 vehicles passing through the checkpoint. Three field sobriety tests were conducted, resulting in one DUI/Drug arrest. The estimated waiting time was a high of one minute and a low to the point where we had to wait for vehicles to approach the checkpoint. The media was notified of this particular checkpoint. In fact, Fox News was given both E-mail and verbal confirmation of

the checkpoint. KVOA posted the checkpoint on a TV story as well as their KVOA.com website. Arizona Starnet responded to my E-mail to the media and was given the location. I also placed a notification on Twitter prior to the operational checkpoint.

At the conclusion of the checkpoint which was 2330 hours, officers and deputies went to saturation patrol for additional DUI patrols.

I completed a Force Commander Summary.

This concludes my involvement in this case.
